SAN MIGUEL CITY IN THE EARLY DAYS



SAN MIGUEL CITY — Established in 1878, San Miguel City was located about a mile west of Telluride on the present site of the Brown Homestead. The earliest settlement in the area, it had a post office, general store and an eating establishment. In 1880, it had a population of 200 men and 5 women. No bars were allowed there, however, and San Miguel City lost its prominence due to Telluride's proximity to mining activity and its tolerance of liquor.
